TOWNSHIP OF CHESTERFIELD ORDINANCE 2019-8

ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK

WHEREAS, the Local Government CAP Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.1 et. seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by Ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by Ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two (2) succeeding years; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Chesterfield in the County of Burlington finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2019 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$ 110,013.51 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government CAP Law, is advisable and necessary; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee hereby determines that any amount authorized herein above that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Chesterfield in the County of Burlington, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY2019 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Chesterfield shall, in accordance with this Ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A:4.45.14 be increased by 3.5% amounting to \$110,013.51 and that the CY2019 municipal budget for the Township of Chesterfield be approved and adopted in accordance with this Ordinance; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that a certified copy of this Ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within five (5) days of introduction; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that a certified copy of this Ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within five (5) days after such adoption.

<u>SECTION 2</u>. There is hereby appropriated from the Chesterfield Township General Capital Fund Balance the sum of \$50,000 to cover the cost of the project described in Section 1.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> This ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption and publication in accordance with the law.

<u>SECTION 4</u>. The capital budget of the Township of Chesterfield is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The full detail of the capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk of the Township and is available for public inspection.

**WHEREAS**, the Township Committee of the Township of Chesterfield desires to make application to the Local Finance Board for its review and/or approval of a proposed CAP waiver authorizing the Township of Chesterfield to exceed its allowable CAP amount by \$748,690.00 pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.3(ee); and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Chesterfield believes:

- a) it is in the public interest to accomplish such purpose
- b) said purpose is for the health, wealth, convenience or betterment of the residents of the Township of Chesterfield
- c) the amounts to be expended for said purpose or improvements are not unreasonable or exorbitant
- d) the proposal is an efficient and feasible means of providing services for the needs of the residents of the Township of Chesterfield and will not create an undue financial burden to be placed upon the Township of Chesterfield;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Chesterfield as follows:

- <u>Section 1.</u> The application to the Local Finance Board is hereby approved, and the Chief Financial Officer along with other representatives of the Township Committee is hereby authorized to prepare such application and to represent the Township of Chesterfield in matters pertaining thereto.
- <u>Section 2.</u> The Chief Financial Officer of the Township of Chesterfield is hereby directed to prepare and file a copy of the proposed CAP Waiver Request with the Local Finance Board as part of such application.
- <u>Section 3.</u> The Local Finance Board is hereby respectfully requested to consider such application and to record its finding, recommendations and/or approvals as provided by the applicable New Jersey Statute.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Chesterfield in the County of Burlington and State of New Jersey that the 2018-2019 local district school tax levy be deferred in the amount of \$5,699,563.50 and the 2018-2019 regional high school tax levy be deferred in the amount of \$2,537,859.00.
